

Section 2.00 Housing

This section presents data on housing Florida's residents and contains data on various housing characteristics: housing units, households, and household size; home purchase prices, mortgage status, and housing costs; homeownership rates; occupancy; medical, nursing home, and assisted living facilities; public lodgings; and mobile homes and recreational vehicles licensed in the state.

Sources. The decennial Census of Housing is conducted simultaneously with the Census of Population and provides basic information about people in their living arrangements. Census counts of housing units, households, and persons per household in every state appear in Table 2.01. The Population Program of the Bureau of Economic and Business Research (BEBR), University of Florida, makes annual estimates of the number of households and average household size for intercensal years. These are published in the series, *Florida Population Studies* and are presented on Table 2.05.

The Census Bureau also releases annual survey statistics from the *American Housing Survey*. Survey data on homeownership rates for Florida, large Florida metropolitan areas, other states, and the United States are presented in Table 2.02 and general housing characteristics for Florida

from the survey appear in Table 2.03. County-level data on the mortgage status of owner-occupied housing units and monthly housing costs appear on Tables 2.11 and 2.12.

BEBR's Economic Analysis Program provides average housing cost data, as measured by the Florida County Retail Price Index. The Florida Association of Realtors and the University of Florida's Media Center provide data on existing single-family home sales and median sales prices in metropolitan statistical areas throughout the state.

Various State of Florida agencies also provide information relating to housing. The Florida Agency for Health Care Administration provides county-level data on nursing home facilities and beds. The Department of Elder Affairs also provides medical facility beds and assisted living facilities data. Statistics on licensed public lodgings, including apartment buildings, rooming houses, rental condominiums, and transient apartment buildings may be found on the Florida Division of Hotels and Restaurants Web site within the state's Department of Business and Professional Regulation. The Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles annually publishes the number of vehicle tags sold to owners of mobile homes, park trailers, and recreational vehicles in *Revenue Report*.
